ANNUAL REPORT



On behalf of TASS, I would to express my sincere gratitude to all TASS staff members wherever they are, without them all these achievements would not be attained, besides this I would like to thank our partners, line government institutions and the communities for their collaboration to serve for the people in Puntland and Somalia in general.

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I. Education

TASS deemed very crucial to support education services to contribute the development, peace and stability of the country as Education is the backbone of every nation to establish its life on the path to renaissance, the organization established its first community school in 1992 in Bosaso, which then expanded to the rest of Puntland regions. TASS community schools are now 22 schools five

secondary and 17 primary schools with total of 7,243 students, 213 teachers, 37 management personnel and 54 casual labors.



Education Sponsorship

TASS considering the circumstance of the students from poorer families, it offered free primary and secondary scholarship in its schools around 1,231 students in different districts, in addition, TASS supported 183 students received partial university scholarship in Red Sea University in Bosaso and Galkayo.

Somali Girls Education Promotion

As this project renewed in late 2017, TASS has conducted just community consultation meetings to update project intervention this benefited around 200 people in target locations.

II. Health

TASS established one of the largest TB control center in Bosaso in 1996, the serves for the patients offering free diagnosis and treatment in collaboration with the ministry of health and its partner Mercy US Aid and Development. It composes of four departments 1) outpatient unit, 2) treatment unit, 3) laboratory unit, 4) pharmacy and 5) feeding unit and 6) HIV / TB Co-management.

In this year under review 2,650 patients have visited the center while 230 were TB positive 17 of them were tested using G expert and 1,811 people were negative, in addition to pre-registered patients who transferred from the prior year were also 353 in total of patients receiving treatment from the center were 583 people in this year under review.







III. Water Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH)

To improve the availability of fresh water for the community and animals in rural and urban areas, TASS drilled and rehabilitated boreholes and shallow wells in the following locations Bosaso TB control Center received borehole, Ulheed borehole, Tawakal IDP Galkaio received borehole, Dhud received shallow well, Bosaso received shallow well, Red sea university branch Galkaio shallow well, Dhagcan and Goda villages borehole received community berkad The beneficiaries of these WASH support interventions are 60,660





IV. Protection

In this year under review. TASS has implemented number of project projects namely; CBCP, CRG, FGM, HPA, PRMN and CHANGES in all 9 Puntland regions.





Community Based Child Protection (CBCP) project

Covered child protection, FGM, Identification Documentation, Tracing and Reunification -IDTR, and Gender based violence- GBV, this project had reached direct beneficiaries 21,222 people in 9 districts with protection through community dialogue and outreach awareness sessions. The project established and trained 70 community protection committees (CPCs) with 1,050 members in target locations are voluntarily involved community level child protection. Likely, 50 Child Rights Clubs (CRC) with 500 members were established and trained to engage child protection at school level in fifty schools. In this year, 1,100 GBV cases were identified and supported and as well 2,000 child protection concerns were also identified and supported by the protection team in nine districts. 345 people from different community groups like women, traditional leaders, youth, and religious leaders and as well government officials at district were



trained CP and GBV prevention response skills. Child Protection Committees network at district level were formed for information sharing and collaboration with the involvement of ministry of Women.

Child Rights Governance

Project seeks to realize the development, survival, protection, participation and non-discrimination rights of children in Puntland-Somalia through applying an integrated program approach where education, child protection and child rights governance initiatives were employed at local level.

The project built the capacity of school children committees, parents committees, CSO and government officials on child Rights Governance to create protective environment for children in addition the supported children with protection concerns as well reaching 4,670 beneficiaries in two regions Nugal and Karkar.

HPA Project

The project has focused on protecting and building the resilience of children living in IDP camps and surrounding communities through provision of child protection, education and Disaster Risk Reduction-DRR interventions reaching 2,420 people IDP school children, parents and CSOs so that to contribute ssurvival, development, participation and protection rights of conflict, drought affected children living in IDP camps and their surrounding communities.

Protection and Return Monitoring Network

It aimed at monitoring the movements and protection concerns of populations in strategic locations within Somalia and at a higher level increase the probability of achieving durable solutions for people affected by displacement, the project supported 245 projection cases in Galkayo.



Community Capacity Enhancement (CCE)

The aim of the project was to promote & educate the project stakeholders in Bosaso to introduce HIV behavioral change so that to reduce levels of stigma and discrimination associated with HIV, key human rights abuses experienced by People Living with HIV and factors that make women most vulnerable to HIV through holding community conversation on HIV in Bosaso with total beneficiaries 480 people.



V. Orphanage Support

Due to the political, and economic crises, the orphans from poorer families faced life-threatening challenges throughout the country TASS dedicated itself to support orphans for fund raising to cover the meals and education fees providing small amount in quarterly basis. Currently TASS supports 630 orphans 322 boys and 308 girls.



VI. Livelihood

TASS in collaboration with various donors has supported 24,500 households with estimated members of 147, 000 people with 300mt of dry foods distributing the most drought affected areas in Puntland in all regions so that cope with the drought impact, this intervention has saved lives of people in target areas.3200 goats were distributed to the vulnerable community members in Eid Adhaha occasion.



VII. Youth project

Pre-constructed Maandeeq Garden and Fitness center has received additional support services like installation of CC cameras, metal sensor door, interlock laid in 2000msq area of center compound, GYM and child playing equipment were installed, the planting of the center done. The center beneficiaries are estimated around 7, 500 people per month.



VIII. Social norms and participation program (SNAP)

This project offers a comprehensive package intervention to achieve sustainable transformation towards greater social and economic empowerment for women and girls, it also Improved knowledge and attitudes to gender discriminatory social norms and Increased social and economic empowerment of women and girls reaching 939 beneficiaries in Badhan Sanag region.



IX. Nutrition & Emergency Health project

This project aims The to contribute to the reduction in child morbidity and mortality related to malnutrition diseases and micronutrient deficiencies among children under five and woman. In this period 34,563 children were screened for malnutrition, 2,552 malnourished children identified and admitted in outpatient program. 383 cases were referred to main hospitals for further treatment, 12,584 children received multi micronutrients tablet 2,1010 children received deworming, zinc and vitamin A supplementation.



Emergency Health

component has target 9 health facilities in Sool and Sanag regions 6,690 children (infant) received BCG vaccine, 7,914 children received measles vaccine, 5,993 children received 3rd dose of pentavalent vaccine, in addition 10,079 mothers received postnatal care while 4,351 mothers received delivery services by skilled birth attendants.

Besides this emergency health intervention, TASS hired doctors and nurse with medical supplies and laboratory who carried out mobile health clinics campaigns in Nugal, Sanag and Bari regions that helped 5,232 patients in rural villages including elderly, women and children.
